## **SITUATION**

Coronary bypass surgery. This is the end of this surgery

# **ACTIONS**

The surgeon asks the perfusionist to start CPB weaning

Perfusionist: doesn't clamp de venous line, doesn't fil the heart → doesn't start the CPB weaning.

# BASED ON ACTIONS – JUDGMENTAL DEBRIEFING

I would like explore the weaning of the CPB

I saw ...I would like, for the next time, you start early the weaning (clamp venous line, fill the heart, ...).





# EXPLORE THE FRAMES – GOOD JUDGMENT DEBRIEFING

I would like to discuss about the CPB weaning I heard ...

I'm worry ...I think ...

I'm really curious to understand what caused you not to start the CPB weaning?

Perfusionist: I had not heard the message because there was a lot of noise in the room.

→ Learning about effective communication
